
Sleepaway Summer Camp 2025

Located 75 miles north of NYC in Dutchess County, Camp Kaufmann stretches over 425 acres and features a lake, pool, archery range, hiking trails, butterfly garden, greenhouse, ropes course, zipline, and so much more! Open year-round, Camp Kaufmann welcomes Girl Scouts from across New York City to learn about the outdoors as they make new friends.

Our seasonal programs include day trips, weekend overnights, and longer sleepaway stays. No matter the length of your visit, you're sure to enjoy the benefits of connecting with nature. Camp Kaufmann is owned and operated by the Girl Scouts of Greater New York and is fully accredited by the American Camp Association.

Juniors attending a six-day session will stay in our outdoor units. Each outdoor unit includes several cabin-style buildings with a shared external bathhouse. Counselors will sleep in the cabin with Juniors.

Friendship Fiesta

Session 1, July 9-11 Session 3, July 23-25 \$350

Become the social star you're meant to be! Junior Girl Scouts will learn to shine in social settings, plan a mini party, and make lasting connections. Activities include role-playing social scenarios, crafting invitation cards. and practicing conversation tips. Earn your Social Butterfly badge while boosting your confidence!

By the end, Juniors will take home their art and jewelry and earn their Drawing and Jeweler badges.

Earth Keepers

Session 2, July 13-18 \$750

By the end, Girl Scouts will be empowered to become nature stewards and earn their Eco Camper and Flowers badges.

After mastering those skills, Girl Scouts will plan a Take Action project to address a real-world community need. Earth Keepers

Session 2, July 13-18 \$750

Through hands-on activities, Cadettes will earn their Eco Trekker and Trees badges while developing a deeper appreciation for nature.

Galactic Mysteries

Session 3, July 20-25 \$750

Explore space and investigation with this exciting adventure! Cadette Girl Scouts will learn about planets and stars through experiments, then master investigative skills like fingerprint analysis, codebreaking, and clue observation. Combining space science with spy games, they'll earn their Space Science Researcher and Special Agent badges while uncovering mysteries beyond Earth.

Act It, Tell It!

Session 4, July 27 - August 1 \$750

Step into the spotlight and bring your stories to life in this creative, confidence-building session! Cadette Girl Scouts will learn the art of impactful storytelling and persuasive speaking as they practice writing scripts, creating characters, and bringing scenes to life. From crafting a memorable screenplay to delivering a powerful speech, this session empowers Girl Scouts to develop their voice and express their ideas in dynamic ways.

Engineering for Good

Session 5, August 3-8 \$750

Step into the world of Design for Good, where Cadette Girl Scouts will learn how engineers use their creativity and problem-solving skills to make a difference! This exciting program will teach campers the fundamentals of design thinking, as they explore how engineers tackle real-world challenges with empathy, imagination, and teamwork. Inspired by their design challenges, campers will come together to plan a Take Action project that benefits their community.

Senior & Ambassador Programs

(GRADES 9-12)

Seniors and Ambassadors attending a six-day session will stay in our outdoor units. Each outdoor unit includes several cabin-style buildings with a shared external bathhouse. Counselors will sleep in a separate cabin.

Senior Earth Keepers

Session 2, July 13-18 \$750

Senior Girl Scouts will reach for the stars as they explore both the environment and the sky in this dual-themed session. They'll engage in eco-exploration activities, contributing to conservation efforts, then learn about clouds, weather patterns, and stargazing. By connecting ecology with sky science, they'll earn their Eco Explorer and Sky badges while deepening their understanding of the world around them.

Ambassador Earth Keepers

Session 2, July 13-18 \$750

Dive into the world of water as Ambassador Girl Scouts explore the importance of water in ecosystems and advocate for its protection. Through projects on water conservation, the water cycle, and testing water quality, they'll develop action plans to raise awareness. Completing the session will earn them the Eco Advocate and Water badges while empowering them to lead sustainability efforts.














Junior Lifeguard

Session 3, July 20-25 \$1,050

If you love to swim and have considered the possibility of becoming a lifeguard, this sleepaway camp session is for you! Senior and Ambassador Girl Scouts will spend time in the pool improving their swimming skills and practicing techniques used by lifeguards to keep people safe in the pool. By the end of this session, campers will have earned their American Red Cross Junior Lifeguard Certification.

NOTE: Campers must be able to swim at least two full laps of the pool to be eligible for this program.

Engineering for Good

Session 5, August 3-8 \$750

Senior and Ambassador Girl Scouts will become *Inventors in Action* as they learn how engineers use design thinking to create solutions that improve lives and protect our environment. Through hands-on activities, teamwork, and a spirit of innovation, they'll explore how creativity and compassion can come together to make a difference. At the end of the week, campers will use their new skills to plan a Take Action project that benefits their community.

Transportation

Camp officially starts at 12:00 PM on the first day of the session and ends at 11:00 AM on the last Friday of the session. There are two main options for getting your child to and from camp.

- Option 1 Drive to Camp: Campers must arrive from 10:00 - 11:00 AM on the first day of the session and depart between 11:30 AM and 12:30 PM on the last day. All cars and noncampers, including caregivers, are required to remain in the parking lot during drop-off and pick-up. If you'd like to see the camp property, we highly recommend attending one of our Open Houses. If you are driving, please do not use the Waze app—it will take you to an address down the street.
- Option 2 Bus to Camp: We offer complimentary bus rides to and from camp from convenient locations across the city. The buses will leave the city between 8:30 and 9:30 AM on the first day of the session and arrive back in the city around 1:00 or 2:00 PM on Friday (exact time will depend on location). The exact address of your bus stop will be sent to you in a confirmation email at least two weeks before your session begins. Noncampers, including caregivers, cannot accompany campers on the bus.





Food

We know that campers can work up a big appetite while they're having fun outdoors! Our staff is trained to check in on campers to ensure they stay hydrated and energized throughout the day. Any eating concerns will be reported to caregivers. We can accommodate most dietary restrictions and allergies.

At Camp Kaufmann, Girl Scouts will eat together in Girl HQ with members of their own unit. Meals may be served either family-style or buffet-style with staff being the ones to handle the food. In addition to hot options, cold options such as cereal, salads, or sandwiches will be available at every meal. Campers will also enjoy snacks and desserts!

Lodging

There is a range of lodging at Camp Kaufmann. Three-day campers will stay in our lake houses that have a large bunk room, smaller bunk rooms for supervising counselors, and two indoor bathrooms with toilets and showers. Six-day campers will stay in our outdoor units, which have 4-6 smaller cabins that sleep 6-10 Girl Scouts. These units have an outdoor bathhouse. with toilets and showers.

Health and Safety

Safety is always our number one priority. Camp Kaufmann has a comprehensive Safety Plan and Communicable Disease Plan. On their first day of camp, campers receive a safety talk.

All staff members are trained to follow procedures based on a variety of safety and emergency scenarios. Most camp staff are trained in First Aid and CPR and there will always be a Camp Nurse on site.

After candidates are interviewed, they are cleared through an extensive, multilevel background and reference check process. After hiring, we provide one to two weeks of staff training, covering safety, programming, routines, the Girl Scout Leadership Experience, and more! Your camper's safety is our number one priority, so we take every precaution to ensure all staff meet our rigorous standards.
