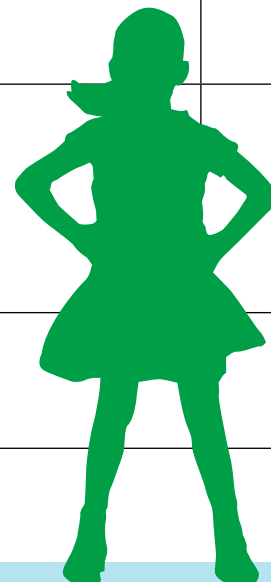
New York, New York — The City That Never Sleeps

Activity	Description	Suggested Level
Battery Park with the Statue of Liberty	Take a photo from Battery Park with the Statue of Liberty behind you! Draw a picture of the Statue of Liberty, as close to the true coloring as possible! Do you know who the sculptor Frederic-Auguste Bartholdi modeled the Statue after? <i>His mother</i>	All
Smithsonian's Museum of the American Indian	Take a photo inside the Smithsonian's Museum of the American Indian (free admission). What is the name of at least one group of American Indians that lived on Manhattan Island? <i>The Leni-Lenape or Lenape</i>	All
Fearless Girl Statue on Wall Street	Take a photo with the Fearless Girl Statue on Wall Street . In what year did she make an appearance near Wall Street? What do you think the Fearless Girl is standing strong against? As a Girl Scout, what is most important to you to stand strong for in your community and world? <i>2017</i>	All
911 Memorial and Museum	Visit the 911 Memorial and Museum . How can you honor those we lost and those that sacrifice so much to help others during our nation's crisis?	All

Your troop will immerse itself in a historical experience during the mini exhibition, featuring memorabilia from the National and World Centers. Eleanor Roosevelt Memorial in Riverside Park	Visit the Eleanor Roosevelt Memorial in Riverside Park . What influential document for human rights did Eleanor Roosevelt help draft? Do you think such a document is important to our world today? <i>Universal Declaration of Human Rights</i>	All
Apollo Theater on 125th Street	Visit the Apollo Theater on 125th Street and write down at least 3 women from its Walk of Fame! Take a photo of their plaques, and research at least one fact about each of the women. <i>Pattie LaBelle, Moms Mabley, Gladys Knight, Aretha Franklin, Ella Fitzgerald</i>	All
Swing Low Harriet Tubman Memorial	Visit the Swing Low Harriet Tubman Memorial between 121st & 122nd Streets and Frederick Douglass Blvd/St. Nicholas Avenue. What important work did Harriet Tubman do during her life? Write a short story about what it must have been like to meet and be alongside Harriet Tubman <i>the Underground Railroad. She helped hundreds of enslaved African Americans find freedom via</i>	All
The Cloisters Museum	Visit Fort Tryon Park and take a photo at The Cloisters Museum . What important drive in Fort Tryon Park is named for a woman? Why is it named for her? Which battle during the American Revolution did she fight in? <i>husband's cannon during the Battle of Fort Washington. Margaret Corbin Drive is named after Margaret Corbin who took over her wounded</i>	All
