Additional Information for Cruise:

- Boarding is at 11:30 am, and sail begins promptly at 12:00 pm. Please be sure to arrive on time so you don't miss the cruise. We dock at 2:00 pm and spend one more hour at the dock!
- There is assigned seating. Please only sit in your assigned seats.
- There is no coat check, so please plan accordingly.
- No uniform is necessary.
- Consumption of alcohol is strictly prohibited.
- Smoking is permitted only in designated areas and never around Girl Scouts.
- Tea and coffee are included with your meal, and other soft drinks will be available for purchase at an additional cost. Please tip your servers.
- Raffle tickets will be available for about \$2.
- Photos of you and your Girl Scout will be available for purchase, about \$20-30.

Transportation Information:

Driving Directions: Take Saw Mill River Parkway south to West Side Highway. Continue south to 23rd Street. Bear right at the Chelsea Piers and proceed to Pier 61, Chelsea Piers. Be prepared for traffic and delays!

Parking: Ample parking is available at Chelsea Piers at Pier 61 (West 23rd Street) for approximately \$35 - \$50.

By Bus: Take north/south route to 23rd Street. Take the #23 bus west to Chelsea Piers (last stop) and walk to Pier 61.

By Subway: Take C, E, 1, or 6 to 23rd Street. Transfer to the #23 bus west to Chelsea Piers (last stop) and walk to Pier 61.

Sightseeing around Manhattan: An ever-changing city experience

You haven't truly experienced New York until you've seen it from the water. It's a whole different world, and there's no better way to do it than from a boat that's just like the city itself. Here are some of the cool things you'll see on our cruise:



- 1 Empire State Building** - This impressive 1,250-foot tower opened in 1923 and was the world's tallest building for 30 years.
- 2 Brooklyn Bridge** - Designed by John Augustus Roebling, the Brooklyn Bridge is regarded as one of the greatest architectural achievements of all time.
- 3 World Trade Center Site** - Built between 1966 and 1976, the World Trade Center's twin towers were once the tallest buildings in the world at 110 stories each. They were destroyed by an act of international terrorism on September 11, 2001.
- 4 Battery Park City** - This office and apartment community was built on the landfill from the excavation of the World Trade Center in 1977.
- 5 South Street Seaport** - Once the heart of the 19th century port of New York City, it has been revived by the transformation of Pier 17 into shops and restaurants.
- 6 Governor's Island** - These 203 acres have been under military command from the 1700s through 1996, making it the oldest continuously operated military post in the U.S.
- 7 Statue of Liberty** - A gift to the people of America from the people of France, "Liberty Enlightening the World" stands 300 feet above New York Harbor. She was built by sculptor Frederic Auguste Bartholdi.
- 8 Ellis Island** - Nearly 17 million immigrants were processed here between 1892 and 1957.
- 9 Colgate Clock** - This stately timepiece once graced the Colgate Palmolive plant. When the factory was demolished in the 1980s, the clock remained.
